He is the author of Land Law (Butterworths / Lexis-Nexis, 1st Edition 1983, 3rd Edition 2007), Breaches of Trust, in Singapore and Malaysia (Butterworths, [1984]) (with Professor Stanley Yeo), a chapter on Singapore in Taking Land - Compulsory Purchase and Regulation in Asian – Pacific Countries (University of Hawaii Press, 2002) and a co-editor of the volume on Land Law in Halsbury's Laws of Singapore.

Bill's practice areas include property related litigation, including trusts (Lai Min Tet & Another v. Lai Min Kin & Another [2004] 1 SLR 499, a case on the presumption of advancement that went to the Court of Appeal), insolvency and general company / commercial law.
